Huddersfield lose out in Jack Lee Trophy Final

A talented Nidderdale team beat Huddersfield on Sunday at Broad Oak in the Jack Lee Trophy Final.

Huddersfield won the toss and batted first on a good wicket but the Nidderdale opening pair of A Lilley and Ormesher immediately had the top Huddersfield batters in all sorts of trouble. The batters had no answer to the controlled and disciplined line and length that they continually produced. At 39 for 5 it appeared that an early finish was inevitable. Enter Jack Oldham (79) and Sam Scott (39) who began to rebuild the innings with an impressive stand of 83. Huddersfield were back in the game, but still 100 short of a reasonable score. Following Scott's dismissal Oldham continued to dominate and was well supported by the best No 10 in the competition, Jonny Butterfield, who produced a fighting 21. Oldham started his Joe Lumb career two years ago with an impressive 70 at Micklehurst and has continued to impress. He always remains focused, takes one ball at a time, and always remains cool, calm and collected. His efforts enabled Huddersfield to post a reasonable total of 202, which although 50 short of the target gave Huddersfield something to ball at.

The Huddersfield bowlers did not ball badly, but Nidderdale were not under any pressure producing a controlled batting display and although the winning runs were scored in the 49th over they were never really under the cosh. This was an exciting and interesting game but Nidderdale were worthy winners. They balled exceptionally well throughout the Huddersfield innings, they fielded well and

never lost concentration. Although Huddersfield made a recovery from losing the first five wickets cheaply it was always going to be an uphill struggle; and so it proved.

Eight of this team will be too old next year, with the majority of them having played for two years, which in itself is unusual in age representative cricket. They will take into later life an experience they should not easily forget. They were winners of the Joe Lumb Cup in 2006 and Jack Lee finalists this year, which in itself is a good memory, but they must also remember the excellent team spirit and the honest desire that generated that success.

As the manager I wish to thank all the players for an experience I will not forget. They have been an absolute joy to manage during the past two years and they can take pride in their involvement. I also wish to thank the parents of 2006 and 2007 who also have been a joy, together with our regular supporters. My thanks also go to Arnold and Geoff for their continued support and Karen, who has scored in every game, due to Tim's absence caused by the success of Honley.

I leave 2007 by thanking the only captain in the history of Huddersfield Joe Lumb cricket to captain the side for two consecutive years, Ben Raven-Hill. As captain you are surrounded by the most talented players in the area, who can all ball and bat and are usually captains of their club teams. Add to that the competitive environment and supporters who "always know better", it is a very difficult position. Ben is a natural leader who makes decisions well and has played a major part in this successful team.

We now move on to 2008, Charlie Roebuck will captain the team and competition for places appears to be as strong as ever. Although I remain well informed of Joe Lumb talent, I look forward to clubs, officials, umpires and friends recommending players who possess Joe Lumb level talent.
