Huddersfield lose by 41 runs

Huddersfield batting disappoints

Huddersfield batting disappoint as 4 of the top 5 batters fail to deliver once again.

Doncaster batted first on a track that was always going to help the bowlers. The opening bowlers Jack Hargreaves and Sam Hall were very effective and had the batters in all sorts of trouble.

Doncaster did start with an opening stand of 55 but they were never in control of proceedings and after the loss of the first wicket Doncaster struggled throughout the afternoon. All the Huddersfield

bowlers were consistent in their line and length and always looked like taking wickets. Sam Denton and Max Gummerson have performed well all season and today was no exception and Tom Barber and Oliver Davidson showed that they will be a force to be reckon with next season. The fielding was as always good but not immaculate, the only disappointing factor being the regular absence of a third man where the run count was high. An 8th wicket stand of 21 was a bit annoying but again a sound performance by the bowlers and fielders.

How the Huddersfield bowlers must be frustrated by the performance of the batters! Once again a mediocre total of 169 looked a million miles away as 4 of the top 5 batters trundled in and out like they were in a dream. Every game 3 or 4 of the top five batters have failed to deliver. What is of more concern is that they all gave their wickets away cheaply, that is they were not out to a wicket-taking ball. They looked like lambs to the slaughter, again! No words are adequate and it needs to be said that it is understandable if it happens occasionally or the batter is dismissed with a good ball, but for cheap wickets to be given away every game this year it becomes totally unacceptable and very disappointing. Simply, the batters must work harder and be more disciplined at the crease and remember that they cannot score runs in the pavilion.

The two batters who have regularly posted scores and have looked disciplined and competitive in all of their innings this season have been Jack Hargreaves (44) and Alex Kemp (33). They both showed a strength of character at the wicket that has been lacking by others. Once again they battled away but the Doncaster bowlers proved too good on the day and Huddersfield were dismissed for a pathetic 129.

The only consolation for the manager and spectators is that 8 of the 12 on duty are available next season. However it needs to be said that one can only hope and pray that they have learned enough to be selected for next season.

Huddersfield continue their league programme with an away game against Sheffield at Treeton C.C on Sunday 3 August with a 1pm start.
